ITHACA- Anthony P. Petrillose, 95, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, February 2, 2010 at the Hospicare Residence. He was born in Ithaca on April 20, 1914, the youngest of 11 children of the late Joseph and Concetta DelMonto Petrillose.

Tony was a graduate of Ithaca High School and served with the United States Army during World War II. He was a 4th Degree Member and Past Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus and a lifetime member of the Immaculate Conception Church.

Tony had owned and operated his barber shop in Collegetown since 1940 first on College Ave. and then moving to Linden Ave. in 1970. He had continued cutting hair at the shop until last year and for the past 50 years he had worked side by side with his son, Joe.
